Standard

This course is an accredited, course and there will be criteria that you need to meet in order to attain the qualification. You will need to also meet certain Learning Skills Council requirements in order for us to draw down the funding for your place. You will be asked to complete a form saying that you will pay any money we are unable to draw down by your not meeting the criteria.

Health and Social Care

Many organisations working in the Health and Social Care sector require good training in key areas.

This course lasts 10 weeks, 4 hours a week to enable course participants to work towards meeting the criteria.

The course consists of the following modules:

- Developing Care Planning Skills for the Care Worker;
- Developing Skills to Provide Personal Care in Care Settings;
- Understanding Stress and Stress Management Techniques;
- Understanding Health Promotion in Care Settings;
- Understanding Mental Health;
- Recognising Issues of Substance Misuse;
- Developing own Interpersonal Skills.

In addition to the taught element, learners will be given access to 1:1 tutorials with the course teacher as well as email support as and when required.

Full support will be given to enable the learner to achieve the qualification. We will carry out an initial assessment on a 1:1 with all learners to identify things we can put in place to help them get the most from the course.

At the end of the course, learners will have six weeks to submit a portfolio for assessment - extensions are available if required. Upon successful completion of a portfolio, the learner will receive two certificates:

- Health and Social Care Certificate;
- National Open College Network, Level 2, Certificate in Progression;

This course is a good opportunity for people interested in working in the health and social care sector to explore key topics they will need to have in order to be successful in the sector.
